





A Budget Request Form is available at the Church Office (on the door) if you see a need to <u>increase</u> <u>or decrease</u> your ministry budget for 2025.



The following additions to our current Bylaws have been proposed and will be voted upon at the annual business meeting planned for Sunday, November 24th immediately following the morning worship service.

- 1) Use of Robert's Rules of Order for all business meetings.
- 2) Voting Any time a vote is required, a simple majority wins. If more than two choices are voted upon and a majority is not achieved, the lowest option(s) are dropped and a second vote takes place with the two remaining options. Majority wins.
- 3) Must be a member to have a seat on the Church Council.
- 4) The Pastor does not have a vote at any business meeting or Church Council meeting.

Deadline to submit proposed bylaw changes to the church office is October 15, 2024.
